Training: You will notice from the individual Chapter reports in this Update that we place great significance on our Members and Supporters reaching training 'milestones' through our progressive patch system that recognises the time and effort they must invest to become part of B.A.CA. This programme is designed to ensure that everyone wearing the Tomato, Chain and B.A.C.A. Member Patches are recognised for what they are ... someone that children can trust. In addition to our own strict programme, B.A.C.A. Supporters receive Basic Safeguarding Training while **all B.A.C.A. Members are Level 3 Safeguarding Trained** and accredited. Our trained Members possess the knowledge required to take an active role in any Safeguarding situation and apply our Safeguarding Policy.

We still know there are many hundreds of children in the UK that experience sexual, physical or emotional abuse and live with the resulting fear and trauma. We know that B.A.C.A. can help them; all

we need is the referral to start the process, which is why we follow an active Agency Liaison programme. Research shows that B.A.C.A. children experience a decrease in emotional stress, show fewer conduct and attentional problems, do better at school, and have improved peer group communication and relationships. Removing fear from abused children ... the essence of the B.A.C.A. Mission: As a body of bikers, we do something unique, we focus entirely on abused children. There is no other entity like B.A.C.A. with the single, narrow focus of removing the fear from victims of child abuse. Fear haunts all abused children. Fear that destroys childhood. Fear their abuser will harm them again. Fear of sleep that brings nightmares. Fear of being alone. Fear of having to testify in court. Whatever their fears, whenever they feel afraid, B.A.C.A. children know that we will be there 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year ... without fail. B.A.C.A. fills a void that is not addressed by any government agency, independent agency, law enforcement agency, private organisation or foundation. The simple truth is, if we don't do it, it won't get done.

Chapter-by-Chapter reports Q4 2021: In Quarter 4, 'physical' Chapter Meetings, Level 1s, child visits and rides continued, and all Chapters were 'out and about' once again, riding together and riding for the children we support. Brigantes Chapter: In addition to being busy with 'working our Mission', the last quarter of 2021 saw Brigantes Chapter welcome three new Supporters, and then see them awarded their Tomato Patches (commonly known in B.A.C.A. as T-Patches). Through dedication and hard work, these patches were gained in time for those Supporters to attend Brigantes first Level1. As stated earlier, the T-Patch is the



first of our training 'milestones' within a progressive patch system that recognises the time and effort our Members and Supporters must invest to become part of B.A.C.A. The T-Patch being the basic requirement for a Supporter to attend a Level 1. So, our

On 11th December, we held our second Level 1, when we welcomed two new Heroes into the B.A.C.A. family. It was a truly wonderful day for us and for our Heroes. Brigantes would like to thank those Members and Supporters from other UK Chapters that were able to join us and brave some lovely Scottish weather!

Thanks to a lot of time and effort by our Members and Supporters, we have managed to break ground with another section of the Scottish Local Authority. We have worked hard to forge good links and ensure they are now aware of us, our Mission and the work we do. Hopefully, this will lead us to be able to empower more Heroes.

Capital Chapter: Q4 2021 proved to be another busy quarter for Capital Chapter with a press interview, Agency Visits, an Awareness Day and two Level 1 Interventions, when we brought more

children into the B.A.C.A. family; more children no longer living in fear. During the first month of the quarter, Dozer our President, was interviewed by the editor of 'The Road' Magazine, which is the official magazine of the Motorcycle Action Group (MAG) and posted to around 50,000 MAG members. The magazine featured B.A.C.A. with a double page spread in the Nov/Dec 2021 issue, again helping us to 'spread the word' about our Mission.

recognise that we are happy to work with them. These meetings also enable us to explain our Policies and Procedures that that make it 100% safe for them to refer abused children to B.A.C.A. During early October, some Capital Chapter Members and Supporters took part in presentations to advocates and counsellors from the Citizens Advice Witness Services at Woolwich Crown Court, when some 12 attendees were introduced to B.A.C.A. We also met with counsellors from Thames Valley Sexual Assault Referral Centre (SARC) at their Slough Office, with a promise to visit their Bicester facility in the New Year.

We also revisited our friends at the Caspian Horse Centre, where therapists use Equine Assisted Techniques to provide

therapy and counselling for some of our children. We were once again greeted by Jan and Naomi, who kindly gave us a talk about the Centre and provided us with tea and homemade cakes. On the way to the Centre, we stopped off at Loomies Moto Café,

near Alton in Hampshire, a well-known biker haunt. We met lot of people who were interested in B.A.C.A. and made a number of good contacts for future presentations.



The beginning of November saw some Capital Chapter Members and Supporters join Midland Chapter for their Level 1 ... thank you, Midland, it was a pleasure to join you and help to show another Hero that B.A.C.A. operates across the UK. The second week of the month saw Capital Chapter organise another of their own Level 1s, when we brought three more Heroes into the B.A.C.A family ... Spike, Chimp and Shorty were delighted to meet their new family and everyone had a great day. Members and Supporters from Readwald (Temp) Chapter joined us for the day.



At the beginning of December, we planned yet another Level 1, where we brought 4 more Heroes (they chose the Road Names: Zeus, Tokyo Revenger, Sparkle Pup and Hercules) into our family. It was a very cold day and as we all signed our names inside the children's cuts, our pens constantly needed warming to work properly! Once again, we were joined by Members and Supporters from Readwald (Temp) Chapter (they just can't stop turning out to work the B.A.C.A. Mission) plus Ursa from Coalfields Chapter. Also, during December the Capital Events Team organised the 'Capital Winter Party',

where we invited all our children to take part in games and eat lots of food. The Party was a huge success, giving children and families the opportunity to meet each other, play and laugh.

Just prior to Christmas, we participated in an evening of 'Christmas Lights', a regular event in Whitchurch, Hants, organsied by a local couple that turn their garden into Christmas Lights experience for children.



Once again, loyal Capital Members and Supporters attended, and the majority of Whitchurch Village turned out to meet us. The event was organised by Ken Morse (kneeling on the left with the Chapter) and

his wife Vicky (seen here dressed as an Elf, alongside the Lady Mayor of Whitchurch and Santa). The Lady Mayor expressed a keen interest in B.A.C.A. and our Mission, and we received another invitation to return in the New Year. Dozens of

children from Whitchurch came to see Santa (Dozer, our President) and the queue stretched out of Ken and Vicky's garden and snaked down the road! The event was even reported in the Basingstoke Observer.

honoured to accompany one of our Heroes to court for her S28 statement. We have supported this Hero during lockdown when she was feeling very low. With the court case delayed again and again, there were times when she simply wanted to give up. We continued to do our best to keep her positive, and when the day came, we helped her to appear before the judge in a clear and determined frame of mind. No matter what happens, we aim to empower all B.A.C.A. children to make a stand, speak their truth and do their part, and

then move on stronger than before.



The rest of the quarter was spent doing the usual B.A.C.A. activities: raising awareness, attending B.A.C.A. child events around the country and enjoying the simple pleasure of being 'on the road' together. During the quarter we also held Awareness Events in Leeds, Manchester and the Wirral, some of which included some very cold camping;



possibly not the best pastime for the winter months. Roll on Summer!

Midland Chapter: Over the last quarter of 2021, Midland Chapter were busy visiting Agencies, attending events and 'spreading the word' about B.A.C.A. and our Mission. On 17th November, Midland

Chapter presented B.A.C.A and our Mission to the Coventry Riders Action Group ... a great evening led by our President, Jock. During December we gave a presentation to Social Workers and Child Protection Agencies to give them an insight into our work with abused children. When the basics are completed, they face several months of intensive training to work with abused children, this includes accredited Safeguarding. We know that our training takes time and demands much, but we are dealing with 'wounded' children, so all our Members and Supporters must be trained to the highest degree ... as we say, it's a marathon not a sprint.

UK President's observations: Throughout Q4 2021, as with every other quarter during the year, UK Chapters have worked diligently to bring abused children into the B.A.C.A. family, to take away their fear and teach them to trust once again. Each Chapter also invests a lot of time and effort to arrange meetings with Child Protection Agencies and Police, attend Awareness Days and generally 'spread the word', to make as many people as possible aware of our Mission. Despite the difficulties and restrictions caused by the pandemic over the past years, this remains an exciting time for B.A.C.A. in the UK. We have new Supporters, new Members and a Temp Chapter working hard to reach full charter. As 2022 takes off, we look forward to continuing our Mission. The principle and promise of which remains unchanged ... to empower abused children not to be afraid of the world in which they live ... together we will continue to deliver on that promise.
