Introduction: Capital Chapter, Bikers Against Child Abuse (B.A.C.A.) United Kingdom, is once more pleased to send our friends and supporters our Quarterly Update, the last one of 2022. As you will see, we continue to work our Mission and to 'be there' for abused children. More people have applied to join the Mission, and more Supporters have graduated through B.A.C.A.'s Training Programme to be awarded their Member Patch. Wearing that Member Patch is much more than a piece of cloth, it brings a huge responsibility, it conveys on the wearer the right, honour and privilege to become a Primary to a Child. That means being on-call for that Child at any time day or night and turning up to be with them, without fail. Many of our children feel let-down by adults; we will not do that.

**B.A.C.A. United Kingdom Help Line:** This last quarter we've been busy 'spreading the word' across Social Media by asking all our friends and supporters to share our Help Line contact information. (Please see our poster opposite.) Thanks to their kindness this poster has spread through Facebook, Instagram and others; the more children and families that know how to contact us, the more abused children we can help. Our **Help Line: 0300 030 2131** and our **Website: unitedkingdom.BACAworld.org** operate all year round, there are no 'closed' times, no 'out-of-office' responses. Children and families can reach us 24x7x365 ... few organisations are capable of making that commitment.

# Removing fear from abused children ... something unique:

Our commitment to be there for abused children is unique. No other organisation in the world does what we do. We focus entirely on abused children; that's why we call them our 'Heroes', because each child has heroically overcome fear. No other entity has the single, narrow focus of removing the fear from victims of child abuse. Fear



that destroys childhood. Fear of sleep that brings nightmares. Fear of being alone. Fear of having to testify in court. Whatever their fears, B.A.C.A. children know that we will be there 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. B.A.C.A. fills a void that is not addressed by any government agency, independent agency, law enforcement agency, private organisation or foundation. **The simple truth is, if we don't do it, it won't get done.** 

Our constant commitment to being better at what we do: "No matter how much you think you know, there's always time to learn more." That's a true statement, and it's something that we believe in and implement. Capital Chapter remains dedicated to training ... we are dealing with wounded children that have been let down by adults ... no matter how much you think you know there's always something to learn. That is why we place great significance on our Members and Supporters reaching training 'milestones' through our progressive patch system that recognises the time and effort they must invest to become part of B.A.CA. and serve our Heroes.

**Proving B.A.C.A. works:** We know there are many hundreds of children in the UK that experience abuse and live with the resulting fear and trauma. Research shows that B.A.C.A. children experience a decrease in emotional stress, show fewer conduct and attentional problems, do better at school, and have improved peer group communication and relationships. 'Ride To The Wall': Duke (our Road Captain) with his wife Fiona, plus Jaxx and Mix, attended this year's Ride To The Wall (RTTW) and laid a wreath on behalf of B.A.C.A. The annual RTTW is a fundraising ride and Service of Remembrance. It's a unique opportunity for organised groups of motorcyclists to ride to the National Memorial Arboretum, Staffordshire to pay their respects and recognise the sacrifice made by the 16,000+ service men and women whose names are engraved on The Armed Forces Memorial.



'The Wall' is a 43 metre diameter stone structure constructed of 200,000 bricks faced with Portland stone panels that hold the names of those honoured by the Memorial, recognising those who gave their lives in the service of the country since the end of the Second World War.

Capital Chapter visits Raedwald Chapter: As their 'mother-Chapter', we continue to work closely with Raedwald Chapter (Temp Charter) who cover East Anglia (Cambridgeshire, Essex, Norfolk, and

Sussex). Two of our Members, Wolverine and Chuck, went to visit them recently. Sponsor for the day. After the briefing, we travelled the 1.4 miles to the L1 location, to meet the Hero and their family. The Midland Security Team quickly secured the area, and we formed a semi-circle around the Hero and family. The Hero was then introduced to his Primaries, and presented with his Vest and Teddy Bear. The bear was previously passed around the semi-circle, everyone hugging each other with the bear between them, to fill the bear with love. The members of his family even hugged the Teddy Bear to fill it with more love. Everyone was then asked to stand by their bikes for the Hero to walk the line and check out the machines. It was a wonderful experience to witness a child warming to their new family."
